As we begin the month of February, a month that is often associated with love, it only seems fitting that we stop and consider how well we love one another. Jesus told us that the second greatest commandment is to "love your neighbor as yourself." But I often wonder how well we, the Church, are doing at loving others. When people think about Christ followers do they automatically think about love? Unfortunately I think the overwhelming answer would be "no.' From a corporate standpoint, the Church has a long way to go in our efforts to love all people. But, if we are to ever succeed in these efforts it must start at an individual level. That is, we need to make a personal decision to intentionally extend love to our neighbors daily.

But what prevents us from loving our neighbors? Sure, there are likely a lot of reasons, but I would imagine that one of the main reasons we fail to adequately love our neighbors is because we don't have time. We leave our homes early each morning and often return well into the evening and our weekends are filled with all kinds of activities. For many of us, our failure to love our neighbors is not a reflection of disinterest or a hateful heart; rather, it is merely a reflection of our fast paced life. Still, no matter the reason, when we fail to love our neighbor as Christ has called us to, we fail to obediently follow Jesus' commands. So how can we remedy this problem?

The most effective way to remedy this situation is to be intentional about loving others. You can start by putting forth the effort to get to know your neighbors. Maybe you need to set aside a couple hours each weekend to sit on your front porch and talk with those who walk by. Or, perhaps you need to take cookies to the new family that moved in down the street or go visit the widow who spends most of her days alone. If we are going to "love our neighbor as ourselves" we must learn to make time for our neighbors.

In just a few weeks we will have a great opportunity to show the love that we have for our neighbors. Hearts for Harlem is a local mission event where we will go into our community and serve those who are in need. I hope and pray that you will participate in this event! I look forward to serving and loving our neighbors together throughout the month.
