Women's Ministry:

MISSIONS...What does that word mean to you? While working in Hearts to Harlem, I realized HBC has a Mission Field within STEPS of our church. As my group delivered beds to a single mom & her 3 sons, the youngest boy stood at the door shouting: "my bed, my bed!" when he saw our truck! As we were leaving, I asked Mom if I could have her phone # so I could call & let her know more about HBC & the ministries we have to offer her and the boys. She was eager to share her information and to know more about our church.

Missions? YES! As I reflect on the opportunities I've had in my life to be involved in Missions, My first experiences began with Summer Youth Choir trips. We traveled by bus to States singing in churches, playing hand bells, helping with VBS, and always staying in the homes of church members . As an adult I went with HBC to NYC and worked in Brooklyn with school children while another group did construction work in the basement. The Guatemala trips gave opportunities to work with children in private orphanages. We also visit the nursing homes. Our spoken languages were different, but our language of the heart was the same! Daniel Ritchie once said," The Great Commission isn't a mission statement for pastors; it is marching orders for the church." HBC are you ready to march?



DiscipleNow Weekend is a big part of HBC's Youth Ministry each year and I expect this year will be no different. DiscipleNow (or DNow) is a fun weekend event designed to usher our 6th-12th grade students into more focused study of the Bible (revolving around a common theme) and worship in an exciting, upbeat atmosphere.

This year the theme for DNow is "CommUnity", and I am so excited about it. Community is a word that gets thrown around a lot these days. It's mentioned in church pretty regularly. But sometimes I wonder what our students are thinking of when they hear the word "community". Does a place come to mind? Their neighborhood, perhaps? Does a person come to mind? Like a friend from school? This year the DNow theme will make students confront the Biblical perspective on what community is all about... and in so doing, it will challenge them to set aside their selfishness, see others as valuable, loved creations of God, and attempt to include everyone in the earthly Kingdom of God.

I am especially grateful for the opportunity to focus on the theme of Community following so closely after Hearts for Harlem – our church's annual community missions effort. I won't speak for everyone involved in this past weekend, but it was wonderful to take part in an event that was much bigger than myself; an event in which our church was perfectly positioned to show the love of God to the surrounding neighborhoods. This neighborly love hit especially close to home for me... literally. The mission site that I got to work on was about 200 yards from my house, basically just across my backyard. At the end of two days' work, I got to speak with my neighbor Mrs. Linda, who has been a widow for 14 years. She was so appreciative of what Harlem Baptist did for her, and seeing her gratitude was an extraordinary blessing to me.

As March begins, I find myself more grateful than ever to be a small part of the HBC Family. And I am proud that we are making attempts to expand our reach into the community around us. As we look outward, let us do so remembering that God has created each and every one of us in His image. We all have a need and desire to be loved. We are all uniquely qualified to love others in a Christ-like manner. And God desires for us to be united to each other through our identities in Him. We must strive for unity within our church – and that bond of love will help us reach the outside world. Pray for our students this month that they will begin to see others as God sees them, and that they will be motivated to show God's love to everyone.
