

**PASTOR'S** DESK

On Tuesday November 3<sup>rd</sup> we will go to the polls to elect the individuals who will lead our country for the next several years. Most notably, we will be electing the man who will serve as president of our great country as well. And, while many of you have probably already cast your vote I do want to share a few pastoral thoughts with you regarding the election and the days and weeks that will follow.

Scripture clearly states how Christ followers are to treat our elected officials. In 1 Timothy 2 Paul urges Timothy to pray for all those in authority saying, "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people – for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness." (1 Tim 2:1-2, NIV). In sum, Paul reminds us of our call to pray for all elected officials (democrats, republicans, independent...etc.). Secondly, scripture also states that we are to submit to the governing authorities. Paul says in Romans 13:1-2, "Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God." Now, I recognize that if the winner of the election is not your choice, many you may struggle to believe that he or she has been "established by God." But, if we truly believe in the sovereignty of our God, then we must also believe that God knows who will win the election and that He in fact has placed that individual in that position. Furthermore, our God will use whomever that may be to accomplish his purposes. Let us rest in knowing this truth.

Finally, I want to remind you that the allegiance of the Christ follower belongs first and foremost to Jesus Christ. In the book of Deuteronomy God says to Israel, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates" (Deut. 6:5-9). Jesus called this (the first part specifically) the greatest commandment. For Jesus, this is THE most important thing for His followers to remember. Over the next several weeks we will each be given opportunities to reveal to those around us, and particularly our children, exactly who our first love is. Our reactions to those who fall on the opposite side of us politically have the potential to be very revealing. Let me encourage you to heed this commandment, and do as God instructed Israel by placing those words in prominent places to remind you and others of your first love.

Did you catch that? Do EVERYTHING without grumbling or arguing. *Everything.* EVERY. SINGLE. THING. I cannot express to you how vital this is during the coming days, that we as believers in Christ be above reproach, "blameless and pure, children of God without fault," by *choosing* to live life without grumbling/complaining, without getting into meaningless arguments with others. Paul says that in this way we will shine as a light among the current generations.

Simply put, this means that arguing because we feel we are in the right, trying to get the last word, demeaning someone's perspective (or worse – their character), and getting angry over their disagreement of our position is explicitly and totally stated to be counterintuitive and counterproductive to the believer's ability to share the Gospel. We cannot be a light in the darkness when we are demonstrating that darkness with a complaining attitude and an argumentative, angry demeanor any time we have an argument with someone and are focused on winning the argument or having the last word, we compromise our relationship with the other person – and with anyone observing the discussion. Let that sink in: our need to be right and win an argument becomes more important than the person we are talking to. Is that truly how a Christian is to live?

We are facing a very volatile time in our country, as Election Day nears, and so we must choose. We can argue and fight and focus on winning political debates in every arena of our lives; or we can choose to live life without grumbling about the election results and decide that arguing our political viewpoint in heated, needless debates is not a productive way to demonstrate the Word of Life to a lost and dying world. Let me be clear: while participating in civic responsibilities such as voting and political office are good and right, it is not a Scriptural or spiritual mandate that politics be our focus or our purpose; our job is to share the Gospel. To be a light. God is still God. He will still be on the throne on November 4<sup>th</sup>. There is no room for debate in Paul's statement. Do **everything** without grumbling or arguing. Even politics. The world does not need another opinion. It needs the words of LIFE. It needs the Gospel *-Rebekah*
