THE PASTOR'S DESK

This past Sunday we began our fall sermon series entitle The Calling: Lessons from the Life of Elijah. As I stated in my sermon this past week, Elijah is widely regarded as one of the most important figures in Israel's history. Now, that is not to take away from the likes of Moses, David, or Esther. Still, the work that God called Elijah to do amongst Israel was both difficult and necessary. Prior to Elijah's work, Israel had been led astray by their king and they had lost their devotion to God. They were wavering between worship of God and Baal. Elijah's job was to remind Israel that Yahweh is the one true God and then lead them back into their covenant relationship with Him.

As I've studied Elijah's life over the last few weeks I've been reminded of just how easily we are led astray. Sometimes we are led astray by our friends or family members. Other times we may be led astray by celebrities or, as in the case of Israel, our nation and world leaders. But, as we see time and time again in Israel's history, we serve a God whose love for us leads Him to send prophets and eventually Christ himself to earth to call us back to himself. The more I think about it, the more I realize that our God is a sending God. He is a God who sent prophet after prophet to Israel to bring them back to himself. He is a father who sent his only son to earth to redeem all of humanity. And, as I think of the reasons why God is a sending God, it seemingly comes down to one thing, we are in need of redirection. We are in need of redemption. Because we are so easily led astray, God needs to remind us, just as Elijah reminded Israel, that He alone is God. But, this isn't the only reason God is a sending God. He also sends because he is a loving God. Even though we waver and are inconsistent, God still sent Christ. We are still his beloved. Perhaps the apostle Paul said it best when he said, "But God proves his love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

As we move through this month may we each be reminded of God's unfailing love for each of us!
