

2020 was a... tumultuous year, to say the least. Considering the Covid-19 outbreak, social protests, and an election cycle that was filled with tension, it was a pretty rough-and-tumble year. A friend of mine who is a pastor in Houston posted this prayer on his blog in the aftermath of George Floyd's death - the date on his blogpost is from June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020. Almost a whole year, later, much of my friend's prayer still feels relevant today. They are words that stuck with me throughout the past year; words that I have prayed myself when I felt like the world was falling to pieces. I want to share them with you all as they might be of spiritual encouragement to you. I especially like how Scripture-driven this prayer is: "Father, we pray for the leaders of our dear country. We ask that you give them wisdom and you may change their hearts so that they may fear you. Leaders who do as Your Words says in Micah 6, 'seek justice, love mercy, and walk humbly' with You – give us leaders like that. And help us to be an encouragement to those leaders when the opportunity presents itself. Father, we pray for justice. You are a God of justice. Your Word tells us in Psalm 98 that justice and righteousness are the foundation of Your throne. As your people, Father, we ask that you move in our hearts to be motivated for justice. To live as Your Word says in Isaiah 1, that we 'learn to do good; seek justice, correct oppression'. Strengthen us towards these ends. When we see what is happening in our streets, may we do as Your Word commands in James 1 – may we be guick to hear and slow to speak. Help us always to do what we can to be peacemakers on this earth. We pray for peace in our country. In Romans 12, Your Word tells us that vengeance is in your hands, not ours. It further tells us that evil is not overcome with more evil, but with what is right and good. Father, it feels like we are in a dark valley right now. There is fear and uncertainty. But Your Word says in Psalm 23, 'Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil. For you are with me.' Lord write that verse on all of our hearts in these uncertain days. Finally, Father, Revelation 21 tells us of a day when there will be a new earth. A day when you will redeem all things. A day when there are no more tears, no more death, no more injustice or suffering. We long for that day. Come guickly, Lord. Save the peoples of the earth, and bring us all to your eternal Kingdom. We love you oh God, but not nearly so much as you have first loved us. Amen."
