And I want to offer a special word of thanks to Rebekah Dickerson for her tireless work and leadership involving decorating. I sincerely hope you all got a chance to go to the Family Life Center at some point this summer, because it was completely decked out! Thanks too, to Alan Hall for running video and audio during our VBS rally times.

Even though Vacation Bible School has ended, the fun and excitement isn't over! There are still big things happening in HBC's children's and youth ministries. At long last, BLAST Children's worship service is back up to all four weeks of the month on Sunday mornings and we are re-starting AWANA on Wednesday night, August $11^{\rm th}$. We are also resuming regular youth group meetings on Wednesday night after taking July off.

Finally, I want to make sure everyone knows we want our whole church family to show up for a deacon-sponsored church fellowship event on Sunday night, August 8^{th} – a night that we are hoping will also prove fruitful in having great conversations with parents and getting children and students signed up for Family ministry weekly programs.
