I do NOT want to call this a New Year's Resolution, but I have been very focused on shaping some of my behavioral routines and tendencies early in the year 2022. These broad-scale changes have only yielded small margins of benefit thus far, but the one place I have made the most progress is in the spiritual discipline of reading.

It is important to note that reading of any kind is not necessarily a spiritual discipline. If you are, for instance, reading "Harry Potter" or "Hop on Pop", that's not really an important tenet of the Christian faith... nor has that really been my aim either. But I have invested much more time and energy into reading Christian literature and texts as well as simply reading the Bible more. Here are a few benefits I have discovered from delving

Ability to focus longer – our society and culture is so ADD. Blame it on commercial advertisements, video games, whatever, but we are always distracted and our attention spans are shorter than ever. That's not opinion, it's science. But I have found after 2 months of following a steadfast reading plan, my ability to focus in general has increased. Now I just have to make sure I am focusing on the right things...

Ability to listen closer - I guess in a small sense I have become a better listener within the context of person-to-person conversations. But more accurately, I mean that reading has helped me become a more careful listener to God. God does not speak in an audible voice. At least not typically; certainly not in the way we wish He would. So He uses a series of other communication methods to grab hold of our attention. And I feel strongly that reading more so far in 2022 has helped attune my ears and my mind a little more to that which God might have to say to me.

More reflective and more conscious decision-making – Again, I do not mean to say that reading has helped me make simple decisions like "chicken or steak" for dinner. I do mean that increased reading of Christian literature has led me to be more aware of the sum total of my spiritual decisions over the course of a given day. It is easy to be aimless, and thus, effortless when it comes to our relationships with Christ. This leads us to be stagnant and inactive in regards to growing in the Spirit and fostering more intimacy with our Creator. However, reading has made me more sensitive to the movement of the Spirit and more cognizant of my need to put time and effort into maintaining my relationship with God - just as I would any other human relationship.

All this to say, if you are READING this newsletter article, I want you to consider joining me in the challenge to spend more time reading. Read the Bible more. Read some more from your favorite Christian author. If you don't HAVE a favorite Christian author, find one. Finally, let me go ahead and bulldoze through two potential excuses you may have

"I don't have the time." – Don't you, though? While you are in the car rider line waiting to pick up the kids from school? Or that 30 minutes before bed when you are usually watching Netflix? Or maybe when you are in the bathroom? I know you are tak-

"I don't have any books to read at home." – Come meet me up at the church office. I have several shelves full of good Christian books. I would love nothing more than to share the joy of reading with you!
