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THE **PASTOR'S** DESK

Several weeks ago Jennifer and I sat down and watched the movie "A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood." The movie is based on the true story of a real life friendship between Fred Rogers and journalist Tom Junod. In the movie, Junod is tasked with interviewing and writing a story on the life of Mr. Rogers. And in the process, Rogers does a remarkable job of extending kindness, hospitality, and love to this journalist. The movie made clear that Mr. Rogers had a desire to spend time with, listen to, and minister to people. He was rarely in a hurry. He was intuitive, sincere, loving, and kind. It certainly appeared to me that Fred Rogers, who was also a Presbyterian pastor, was intentional each day to put on Christlikeness.

I must confess that I came away from that movie with deep conviction. Although I like to think that I am accessible, kind, sincere, and loving I know that these characteristics are not always evident in my life. There are occasions when I'm "too busy" for others, knowing that I will spend at least an hour sitting on the couch watching television later that evening. There are times when my sincerity and love is nothing more than a really good acting job. We are, at times, too busy to be accessible, kind, sincere, and loving to one another. This however, is problematic for the Christ follower. We've been called to put on Christlikeness. And didn't Christ make time for others? Sure He did! In fact, I think we would quickly recognize that in Jesus' three years of public ministry he was highly accessible, always sincere, and a constant source of love and kindness.

As I write these words I imagine that many of you are thinking the same thing. "Carson, I'm barely accessible to my own family, how can I be accessible to those outside of my household?" Well, let me first encourage you to figure out how to be accessible to your family. If you're not making time for your spouse and your children it is only a matter of time before major conflict will creep into your lives (if it hasn't already). As a whole, we need to do a better job of creating schedules that allow for breathing room. We need to create routines with the expectation that the Spirit will lead us towards opportunities of ministry. That is, we need to expect that there will be someone who needs us to lend them our ear. There will be someone who needs us to extend kindness and love. These things will never happen if we don't first commit to intentionally creating space for these opportunities. Who is it that needs you to simply listen to them today? Who needs your sincerity, love, and kindness? May we strive daily to eliminate some of our busyness so that we can better minister to one another!



The Easter season is one of the busiest of the year on the church calendar, rivaling that of Christmas and lasting longer. I enjoy the challenge that this time of year brings, along with the personal reflection the story of the Cross and Resurrection calls to mind. We are given so many opportunities to share the Gospel, to tell our story and why

we celebrate Easter, and to renew our hearts in worship and service to our Great God during this time that by the morning the Easter arrives – celebration is the only possible result. I am so thankful we serve a God of seasons – one who designed our lives to ebb and flow, to grow and change, to never stay stagnant. Some seasons are harder than others. Seasons of grief, pain, poverty or struggle do not seem good at the time (and they seem to last forever). Other seasons of joy and excitement, becoming new parents, an upcoming wedding, graduation – those season are sweet, yet seem to be gone in the blink of an eye. But seasons are how we grow – physically and spiritually. God will pull us into a season we struggle to understand, yet on the other side of it we can see His guiding hand. Our reaction to the more trying seasons is often the determining factor as to how long and how hard they are. Sometimes we resist the forward motion the season demands – perhaps by refusing to make a decision we know God is calling us to or being unwilling for Him to bring about change in our lives or ourselves. By doing this we extend the life of a longer season, instead of walking forward with God into the next season. Perhaps it is fear of what the next season will bring that holds us back. Perhaps we are unsure of what God wants from us. We have all felt this way from time to time.

Embrace your season. Whatever it may be. Hard or happy. Encouraging or exhausting. Full of promise or full of pain. You don't have to put on a fake smile and force your feelings; that isn't what God asks of us. But embrace the change. Embrace the reality of what you are facing. Tell God that you are not okay. Tell him that you are scared or hurting. Share your heart with Him, and open up your heart for His grace and peace. Don't try to "get through" the season by ignoring it; embrace it. This may be a season you wish was over; but grow through it anyway. Worship anyway. Serve anyway. The God who holds the universe is still holding you in His hands. He will continue to walk beside you on your journey, season by season – lean into His love and
